

Electronics Drop-Off Recycling

Now Offered Year-Round to ALL West Alabama Citizens, Gov't Agencies, Schools & Businesses!

The city of Tuscaloosa Environmental Services Department welcomes all residents, government agencies, schools and businesses in West Alabama to recycle their old, unused and broken electronics. Accepted electronics (listed below) can be dropped off at the Richard A. Curry Environmental Services Complex, located at 3440 Kauloosa Ave between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

Electronics will NOT be accepted on City Holidays, after-hours, on weekends, at drop-off recycling trailers, or on curbside recycling routes.

Normal Drop-Off: Park in Designated Parking Space at ESD

- All drop-offs will require citizens to come to front door of Richard A. Curry Environmental Services Dept. Complex to sign in and let the staff know what type of electronics they have to recycle.
- ESD crews will come to your vehicle to collect all recyclable electronics
- Absolutely NO citizens or vehicles will be allowed to enter the recycling plant

Large Drop-Off: Call Ahead to Schedule (205-248-4900)

- Citizens or groups with large quantities of electronics are required to call ahead and schedule an electronic drop-off appointment.

Why Should we Recycle E-Waste?

"E-waste" contains valuable, recoverable materials such as aluminum, copper, gold, silver, plastics, glass, and ferrous metals. Instead of wasting natural resources and money needed to produce new electronics, electronic equipment should be recycled, and not thrown away.

Why Should we keep Electronics Out of Local Landfills?

Along with valuable materials, "e-waste" also contains toxic and hazardous materials including mercury, lead, cadmium, beryllium, chromium, and chemical flame retardants. These materials have the potential to leach into our soil and water and harm our local environment and health if not properly handled and recycled.
